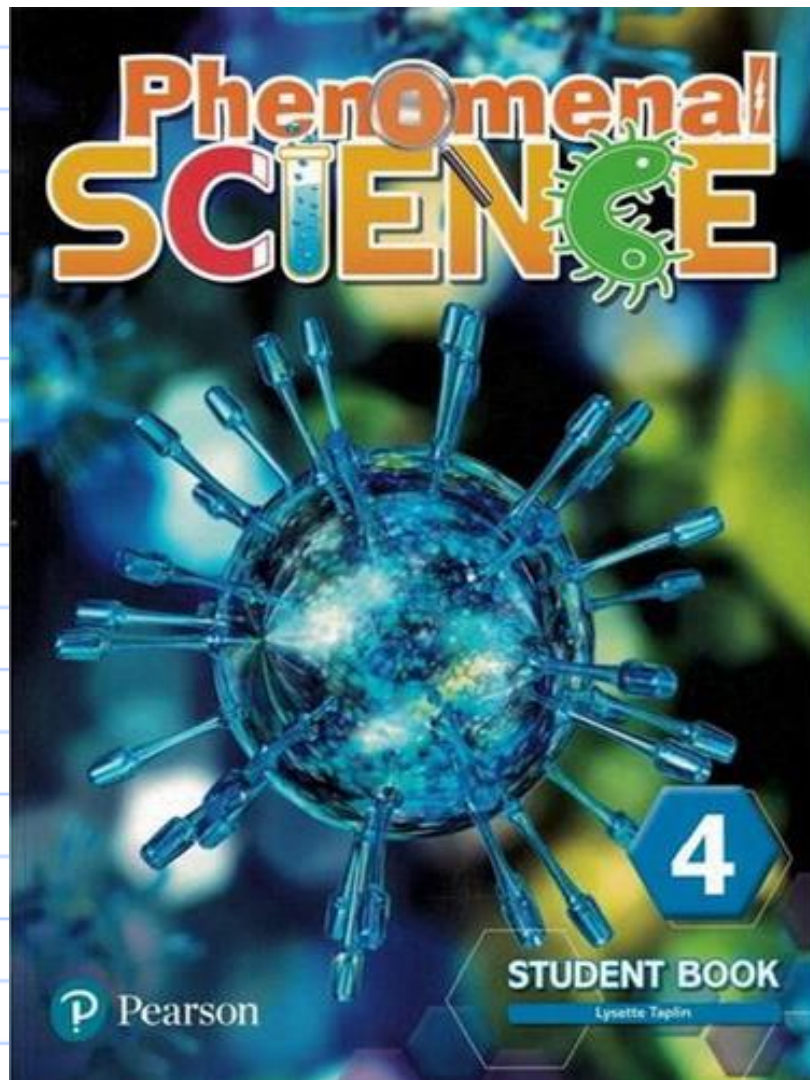

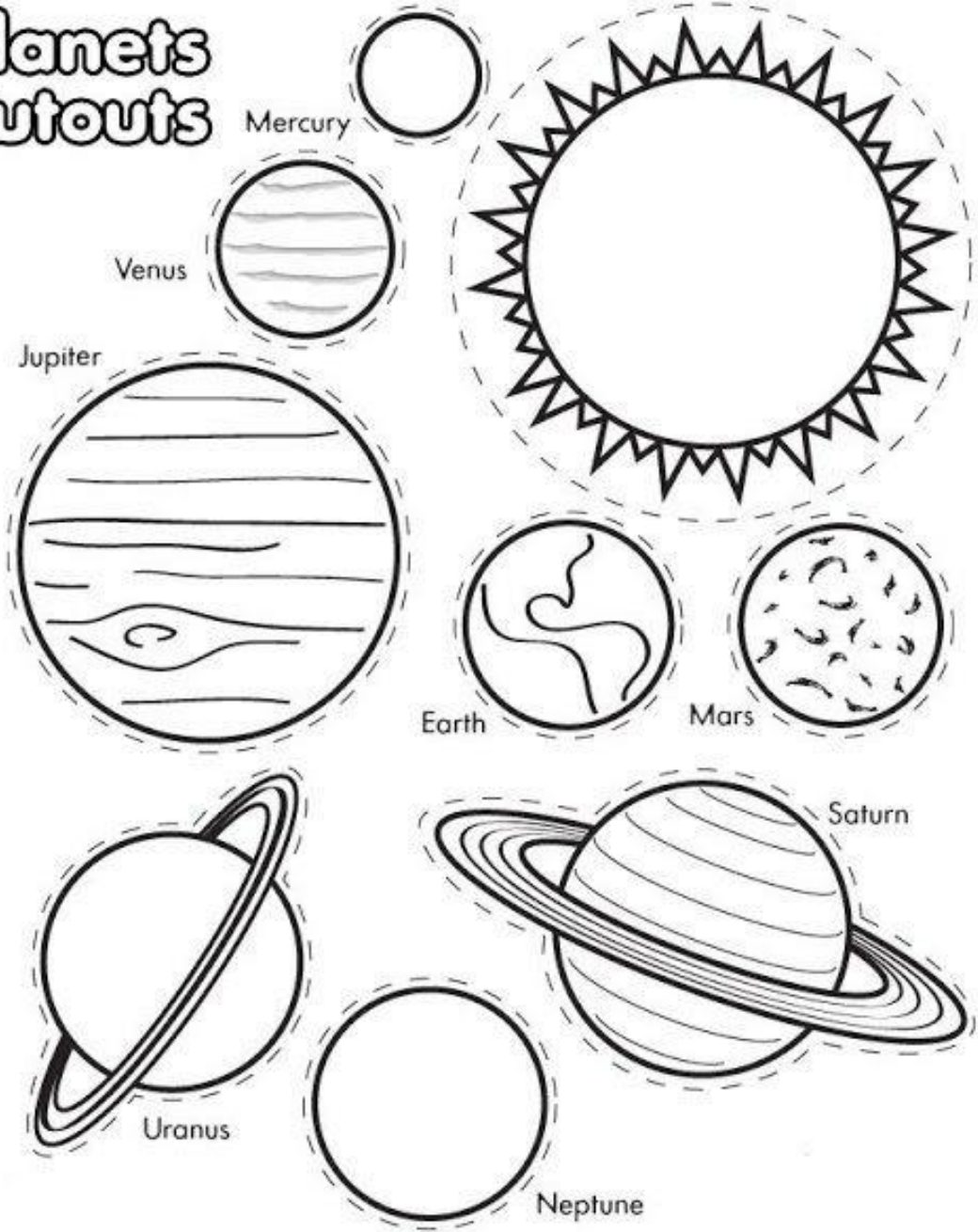

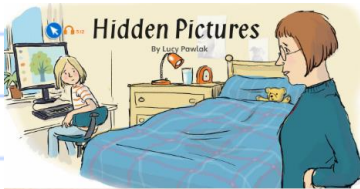

Hidden Pictures
