

Fairytale	A folktale that takes place in a magical land Includes royalty, good and evil characters, and has a happily ever after	-Cinderella -Snow white -Sleeping beauty
Fable	A short folktale where the personified animals teach a moral or a lesson	-The tortoise and the hare
Legend	A folktale that takes a real historical person or event and combines it with fictional characters usually exaggerations and are humorous	-Robin hood -King Arthur and the round table
Tall tale	A folktale that has unbelievable exaggerations but, told as if they are true	-Pecos Bill
Myth	A folktale that explains something about the world and how natural forces come to be	-The Midas Touch -Hercules
