object + **verb** + **subject**

Ex.

The house was painted by Peter.

Passive Voice

Present simple

- Somebody **cleans** the classroom every day. (Active)
- The classroom **is cleaned** every day. (Passive)

Past simple

- Somebody **cleaned** the classroom yesterday. (Active)
- The classroom **was cleaned** yesterday. (Passive)

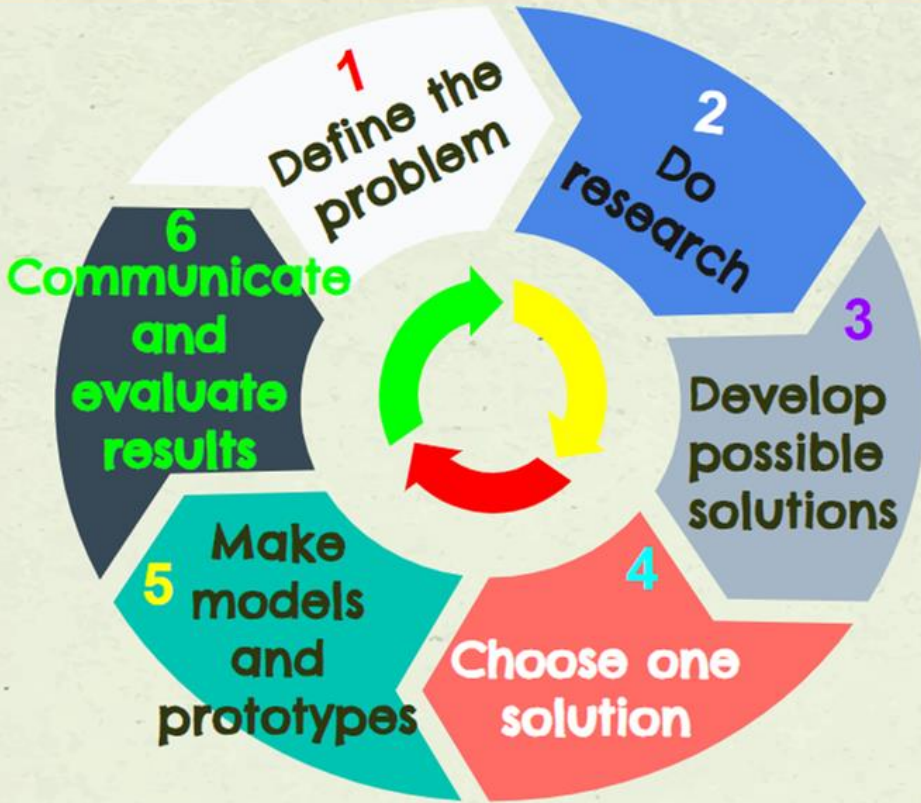
