Literary Genres	Mystery a fictional story that revolves around discovering secrets or solving crimes	Legend a folktale that is based on a real person or event but cannot be proven	Poetry uses sound, rhythm, and word choice to inspire thoughts, feelings, and
Tall Tale a folktale that is often humorous and assumed to be untrue	Fable a folktale that often teaches a moral or lesson using animals as characters	Fairy Tale a folktale that has magical forces and beings, and includes improbable events that lead to a happy ending	Historical Fiction a fictional story with real and made-up characters that is set in the past
Science Fiction a story that is often set in the future or in different worlds that includes technology or science	Informational a nonfiction writing that is about a specific topic	Myth a folktale that is considered sacred and that attempts to explain how things came to be	Biography a story of a real person's life that is written by another person
